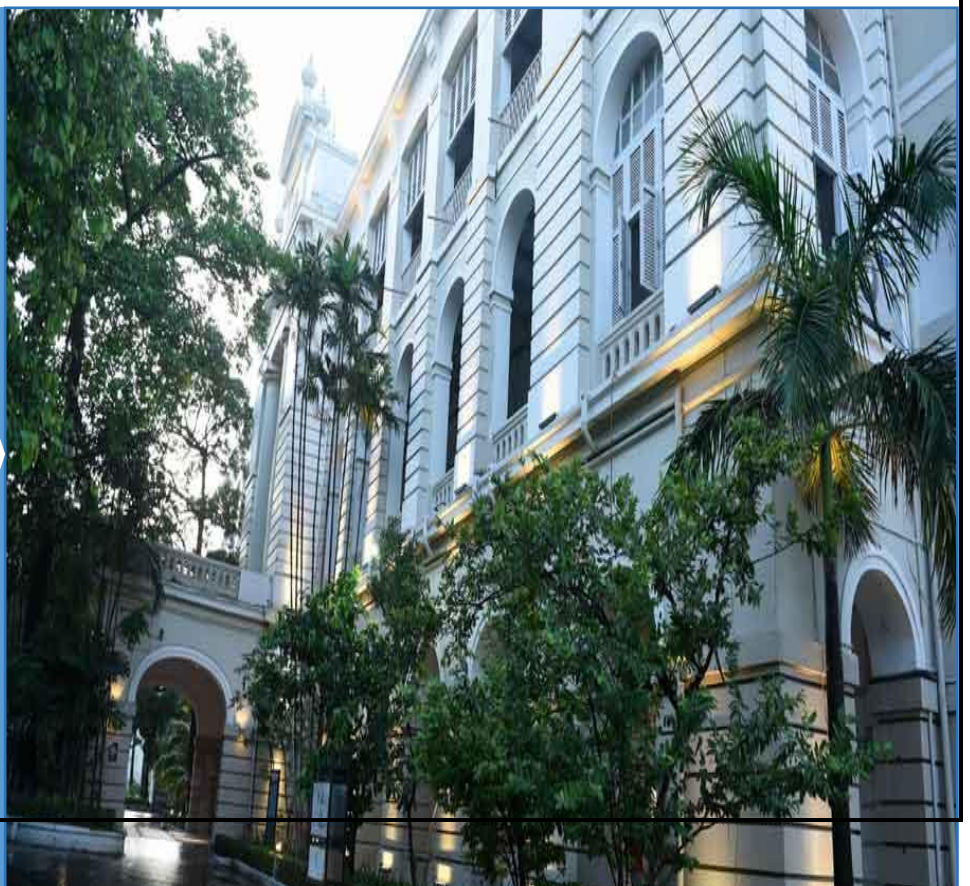

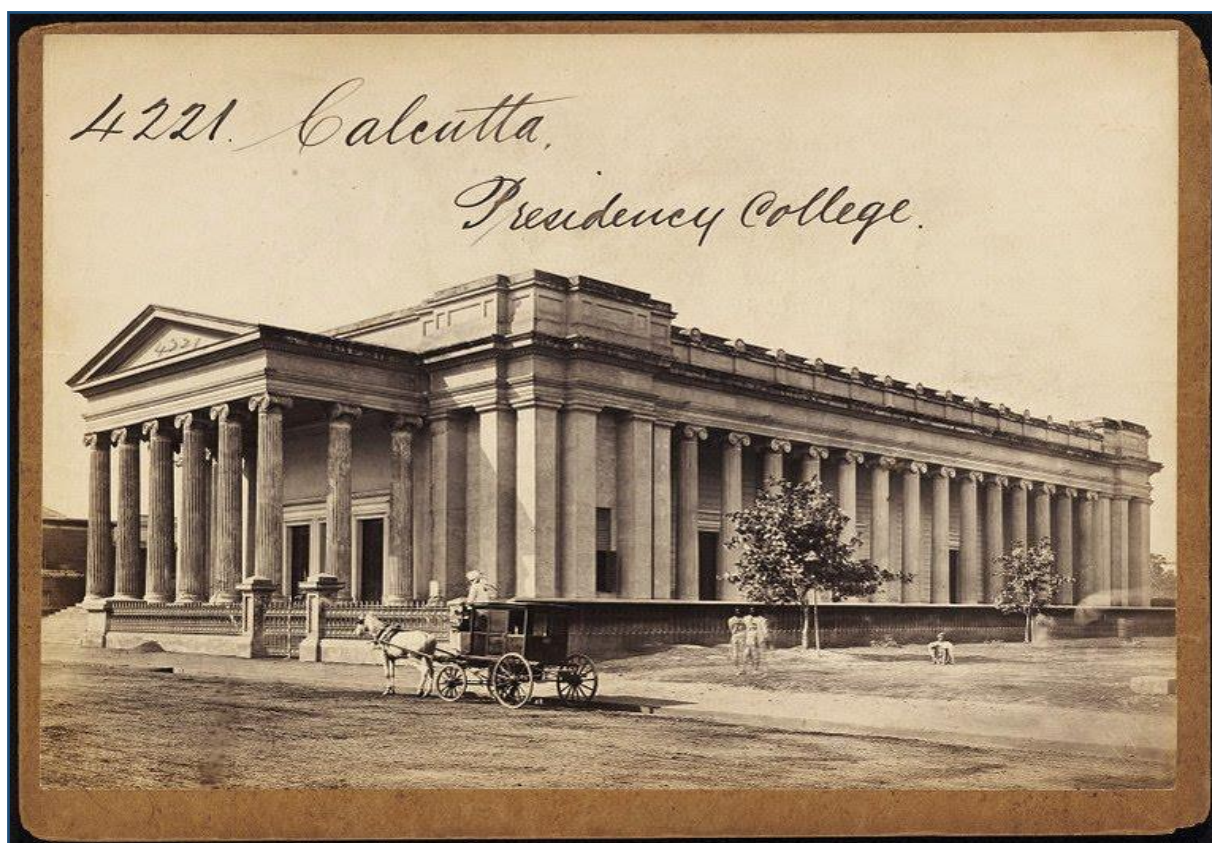
## Objectives

### 3. Presidency University Library: A Brief Introduction

The Presidency University (Erstwhile Hindu College/Presidency College) Library has a very unique and rich collection of books, periodicals, and manuscripts along with electronic and multimedia resources. The collection includes some of the rarest books and reference materials along with thousands of important documents and journals.



The University Library comprises of two main units - i.e., - the Arts Library, and the Science Library alongside the individual departmental libraries. The primary aim of the library is to support the academic and research programs of the University by providing access to its rich physical and digital repositories of learning resources. With its rare archives and the most current databases, the University library is designed to cater to the University's current and future teaching and research interests

#### **4.1 Guidelines for Fair Use of e-Resources at Presidency University Library:**

1. Electronic resources such as e-journals, e-databases, e-books made available by the Presidency University Library, Kolkata are for academic use.
2. These resources can be searched, browsed may be downloaded and printed as single copies of articles as done in the case of printed library material. Downloading or printing of a complete book or an entire issue or a volume of one or more journals (called systematic downloading) is strictly prohibited
3. Use of robots, spiders or intelligent agents to access, search and/or systematically downloading from these resources is also prohibited. Any violation of this policy will result in penal action as per the rules and regulations of the University.
4. Please be aware that systematic downloading may cause the publisher to block to the entire community of users @ Presidency University from accessing their resources.
5. The Central Library subscribes to thousands of E-Resources directly through the publishers and eSS Consortium. The terms and conditions for using these resources are spelled out in electronic resource licensing agreements with each publisher. Individual users must ensure that the use of electronic resources does not breach the terms and conditions specified in the license agreements. Licenses vary from publisher to publisher.

**4.2 The general principles are as follows:**

Permitted	Not Permitted
Viewing, downloading, copying, printing and saving a copy of search results	Use of robots or intelligent agents for systematic, bulk or automatic downloading is not permitted
Viewing, downloading, copying, printing and saving individual articles	Systematic downloading or printing of entire journal issues or volumes, or large portions of other e-resources is not permitted
Using e-resources for scholarly, educational or scientific research, teaching, private study and clinical purposes	Using e-resources for commercial gain is not permitted (i.e. reselling, redistributing or republishing licensed content)
Sending a copy of an article to another authorized user (i.e. current faculty, students or staff)	Transmitting, disseminating or otherwise making online content available to unauthorized users (i.e. sending to mailing lists or electronic bulletin boards) is not permitted
Posting the URL to the publisher's version of the article on a class website (publisher links will allow only authorized users access)	Posting the publisher's version or PDF of an article to an open-class website is not permitted (instead, post the URL to the article which will allow only authorized users access)

Breaches of the license agreement with publishers could result in the suspension of access to the resources for the member institutions.

**5. Categories of electronic resources:**

An electronic resource is defined as a resource that requires computer access or any electronic product that delivers a collection of data referring to full-text bases, electronic journals, image collections, other multimedia products, and numerical, graphical or time-based, as a commercially available title that has been published with an aim to being marketed.

The different types of e-resources are:

S. No	E-Resources Type	Description
1	E-Book	A book is composed in or converted to digital format for display on a computer screen or handheld devices such as Kindle, iPad, etc. is termed as E-books. E-books are the digital version of the books.
2	E-Journal	An electronic journal is a periodical publication which is published in electronic format. E-Journals are electronic counterpart to traditional print journals, offering an efficient and convenient way to access and distribute academic research and scholarly content.
3	E-Magazines	E-Magazines are electronic counterpart to traditional print magazines. E-magazine is a very important part of every library collection



4	E-newspaper	Abstracting and Indexing database are specialized information resources that index and abstract academic and scholarly literature.
5	Indexing and Abstracting Databases Today are either free or with charges.	A Full Text Database refers to a type of electronic database that provides access to complete documents rather than just bibliographic information. These databases contain the entire text of articles, reports, and other resource, making them valuable for in-depth research and analysis.
6	Full text database	A comprehensive, integrated, non-redundant, well-annotated set of reference data or information available in these databases.
7	Reference database	These databases are contained with PhD thesis and Dissertation published in e-format.
8	E-Thesis	A book is composed in or converted to digital format for display on a computer screen or handheld devices such as Kindle, iPad, etc. is termed as E-books. E-books are the digital version of the books.
